**WHEN USING ANY COPYRIGHTED WORK, GIVE CREDIT TO ITS CREATOR.**

## **DEFINITIONS**

Copyright: rights given to the creators of original work, protect how the creations are copied, used, and distributed. Ideas cannot be copyrighted.

Fair Use: right of people to use copyrighted works in a fair manner. Permission to use the copyrighted work is not needed if it falls under Fair Use.

Transform: to convert the original to a new form and a new purpose.

Public Domain: works that are not owned by anyone so are free for anyone to use for any purpose.

## **WHAT COUNTS AS FAIR USE OF COPYRIGHTED MATERIAL?**

***You must consider these 4 criteria to decide if it's Fair Use:***

1. The purpose and character of the use - Did you transform the original?
2. The nature of the material - Is it factual, creative, consumable?
3. The amount used - Did you use only the amount necessary?
4. The effect on the market for the original - Are you taking someone's profits?

## **Creative Commons – [Creative Common Search Site](#)**

**Creative Commons (CC)** is a non-profit organization devoted to expanding the range of creative works available for others to build upon legally and to share.

A **Creative Commons license** is one of several copyright licenses that allow the distribution of copyrighted works. The licenses differ by several combinations that condition the terms of distribution.



**Attribution (by)** Licensees may copy, distribute, display and perform the work and make derivative works based on it only if they give the author or licensor the credits in the manner specified by these.



**Noncommercial (nc)** Licensees may copy, distribute, display, and perform the work and make derivative works based on it only for noncommercial purposes.



**No Derivative Works (nd)** Licensees may copy, distribute, display and perform only verbatim copies of the work, not derivative works based on it.



**Share-alike (sa)** Licensees may distribute derivative works only under a license identical to the license that governs the original work.
